

Legislative Weekly Report: Week 7

# **OVERVIEW**

This week in Tallahassee, the Senate Education Committee took up its own version of House Bill 7055. The Senate's version has many of the same priorities as the House, the differences have been outlined below.

On Friday, Governor Scott and legislative leaders released their school safety plans. They both include:

- Increase minimum age for purchasing fire arms to 21 years
- Establish a 3 day waiting period for purchase of firearms
- Ban bump stocks

Additionally, the Governor has included:

- \$450 million for a variety of student safety programs
- \$50 million for mental health initiatives

We expect to have more details on the Legislature's plan this week. The Governor's plan can be viewed <u>here</u>.

In Washington, the President held a listening session regarding gun control and school safety. His takeaway was that we should arm our teachers.

### SENATE COMMITTEE HEARINGS

Below is a summary of the Senate Committee and Subcommittee hearings this past week.

#### Education

The committee considered the following legislation:

• <u>HB 7055</u>: Education by Education Committee, passed 9-0 with amendment Senator Farmer included an unfriendly amendment by a vote of 5-4 that removed the recertification requirement for teachers unions.

The bill includes:

- o The Hope Scholarship (the Senate version grants vouchers for students with substantiated claims of being bullied, which is not included in the House version.
- Funding for expanded mental health services
- o Financial Literacy Course Requirement
- Legislator visitation of public schools

• <u>HB 323</u>: Education by Rep. Fitzenhagen, passed 16-2
